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NOTE OF INTEREST

The Ready to Smile Steering Committee appreciates Angie Webster's service on the Committee. Angie had to resign due to a shift in her career. Angie was a school nurse at Blossom Gulch School in Coos Bay and was instrumental in helping the Steering Committee understand the significant problem of dental pain and tooth decay among South Coast children. She is now working at Bay Area Hospital.

Ready to Smile was launched in 2010 by The Oregon Community Foundation's South Coast Regional Action Initiative, with support from The Ford Family Foundation. Coordinated through the Coos County Public Health Department, *Ready to Smile* delivers dental health services to eligible children in grades K-7 in Coos and Curry counties.

SOROPTIMIST CLUB PARTNERS WITH READY TO SMILE

Soroptimists of the Coos Bay Area have partnered with the *Ready to Smile* program. Over the past few years, the Bay Area Soroptimists have had their own dental care awareness program in the Coos Bay/North Bend schools. Initially, the club received a grant from Bay Area Hospital along with donations of toothbrushes, toothpaste and floss from area dentists. These were then assembled into 2,500 dental kits with brushing instructions and distributed during January and February each year in recognition of National Dental Care Awareness Month.

Now, with Ready to Smile, the Soroptimist club has been able to continue their annual distribution by funneling the kits through the Ready to Smile program, coordinated by Cecilee Shull. The Soroptimists recently requested and received a \$750 grant from the Coos County Commission on Children and Families, which will allow them to prepare more dental kits to be distributed to Coos and Curry County students.

The local Soroptimist club wants to enlist help from the clubs in Gold Beach and Brookings to make the dental program a region wide project. Soroptimist is an international volunteer organization for business and professional women who work to improve the lives of women and girls (as well as children and youth).

Portable dental unit donated

On March 23, 2011, oral surgeon Dr. Dane Smith of Coos Bay, donated a portable dental unit to the Ready to Smile program. The unit helps the Ready to Smile team provide sealants for students. It will be used as a back up.

Previously, the *Ready to Smile* program did not have a back-up system. If the *Ready to Smile* team was at a local school performing sealants and the system malfunctioned, they would have to cancel the remainder of the day to seek repairs. With the system donated by Dr. Smith, the program now has a back—up plan and is no longer concerned about the portable equipment breaking down.

Thank you to Dr. Dane Smith for his ongoing support and continued mentoring of the *Ready to Smile* program!

Matching Grant Opportunity

In recognition of National Children's Dental Health Month, the Mildred E. and Harvey S. Mudd Foundation of the Sprague Family Foundations announced a matching grant opportunity for the South Coast Ready to Smile program of The Oregon Community Foundation.

The Mudd Foundation will match cash and in-kind resource contributions, including volunteer time, up to \$40,000 through 2011. Donations must be received by December 31, 2011 to be eligible for the match. All contributions will support direct services and coordination efforts through the regional *Ready to Smile* program. Medical Teams International visits the South Coast of Oregon

The Medical Teams International mobile dental van will be visiting the south coast of Oregon on Friday, April 29. They will be at the Myrtle Crest Elementary School seeing students in grades 3-8 from Powers, Myrtle Point, Bandon and Coquille school districts.

In many communities around the world, dental care is nonexistent. Dental pain and abscesses are common problems and quickly become lifethreatening without treatment. Medical Teams International works with local partners to provide dental care to families who would not normally have access to a dentist.

Mobile Dental:

The mission of the Mobile Dental Program is to provide free or low-cost dental care to low-income children and adults, the homeless and migrant workers who lack insurance or a realistic way to pay for treatment.


Mobile Dental Fast Facts:

- Mobile Dental has provided care for more than 176,000 patients since 1989.
- In 2010, Medical Teams
 International's Mobile Dental program provided free dental care to more than 17,000 patients with over 300 partners.
- Nearly 900 generous volunteer dental professionals provided approximately \$7 million worth of free dental care last year.
- Their fleet of eleven Mobil Dental clinics in Oregon and Washington are converted 38-foot motor

homes. Each mobile clinic contains two dental operatories and all necessary equipment, instruments and supplies.

Gold Beach Rotary Club jumps in to help Ready to Smile program

On January 5, 2011, an ordinary Ready to Smile Rotary presentation quickly built a donor relationship for the program unlike any other. Cecilee Shull, Ready to Smile Program Manager, was describing to the Gold Beach Rotarians the photos in her presentation. A student receiving dental sealants was shown holding a plastic bin on his chest which held instruments for the dental team. Cecilee explained the need for a portable dental tray unit for the program, but due to budget constraints, that purchase was going to have to wait.

The floor was opened for questions at the end of the presentation and the first person to raise his hand was Dugie Freeman of Freeman Marine in Gold Beach. Dugie stated, "If you get the dimensions and technical information on what you want, we can build you a dental tray and donate it to your program."

Immediately following the meeting, Tim Wilson, an engineer for Freeman Marine, visited Riley Creek Elementary

School to take measurements and ask technical questions in regards to the equipment needed for the visiting dental team. Approximately six weeks later, the program received a call from Tim stating that the dental tray was ready for pick up.

On March 9, 2011, the dental team used the new piece of equipment for the first time. What a difference it has made for dental hygienist Astrid Diepenbroek and dental assistant Verena Caudle in accessibility to the instruments! The new equipment has made a large ergonomic impact, resulting in less back and neck stress previously associated with the improper placement of the dental tray.

Thank you to Dugie Freeman, Tim Wilson and the crew at Freeman Marine in Gold Beach for developing the portable dental tray for the *Ready to Smile* Program. If purchased, the new tray would cost more than \$1,000. Now, *Ready to Smile* has a "one of a kind" portable dental tray that is priceless!
